#### Program Overview

Through a series of articulation agreements, Saint Leo University students have the opportunity to spend a semester studying in Rome, Italy; Madrid, Spain; Paris, France; London, England; Limerick, Ireland; Dundee, Scotland; Various other cities within England; Heidelberg, Germany; Río de Janeiro, Brazil; Tokyo, Japan; Sydney, Australia; India; China or a Semester at Sea.

Currently, Saint Leo University maintains articulation agreements with John Cabot University, Suffolk University, IRSS, IIP/Anglo-Educational Services, MacQuarie University, International College of Management, Sydney, Globalinks Learning Abroad, CEPA, Temple University, Alliance for Global Education, IFSA-Butler and Semester at Sea.

Saint Leo University requires students who wish to study abroad to meet the following minimum requirements:

- \* Junior Standing
- \* CUM GPA -- see specific program
- \* Major Department Approval
- \* Academic Advisor Approval

Saint Leo University financial aid packages are available for Study Abroad programs.

Juniors and seniors will be allowed to study abroad during the fall semester. The only exceptions will be made for fall athletes. In addition, a limited number of semester slots are available for each academic year. A February 1 deadline will be strictly adhered to for the next academic year enrollment. Students should be sure to turn in their completed study abroad approval forms prior to the deadline to ensure ability to travel for the following semester. Reservations are taken in the order that completed forms are brought to the office. ## (12) SEMESTER AT SEA

## Offerings:

Semester at Sea offers up to 75 courses across several disciplines of study. Course syllabí reflect the expertise of the faculty member and the itinerary. For example, on voyages that travel to a specific region (such as summer voyages to the Mediterranean), you are likely to find that the "World Literature" course focuses mostly on literature from the nations visited on the itinerary, rather than the entire world.

About 2/3 of our courses are upper-division and 1/3 are lower division.

About 2/3 of our courses are offered on every voyage, while the remaining 1/3 of courses are unique to that voyage.
